

## Looking Forward, Projecting Outward

**Grade Range:** PreK-2<sup>nd</sup> grade **Time:** 35 Minutes

**Synopsis:** Self- esteem gives you the courage to try new things and the power to believe in yourself. It lets you respect yourself even when you make mistakes. Practice positive self-esteem with this creative and visual activity.

## Materials:

- 12 x 18 Construction paper or 8 x 12 if not available
- Scissors
- Glue
- Crayons or colored pencils
- Picture handout included

## Instructions:

(steps 1 & 2 may need to be pre-done depending on the size of your group and their age.)

- 1. Cut out shield.
- 2. Across the top, have the student write his/her name
- 3. Using the picture handout talk about different things they like and are good at doing (talents).
- 4. Color the pictures that fit their likes and talents.
- 5. Cut them out and glue them to the shield.
- 6. At the end, ask the children to describe what their shield represents.

Optional : To encourage movement, have a parade around the room or school proudly holding their shields in front of them, displaying their likes and talents.
