

MLK Day Eggs-periment

Adapted from littlekinderwarriors.com (Life Skills)

Grade Range: PreK-2 **Time:** 20 minutes

Synopsis: Students will examine two different eggs to discover what makes them different and what makes them the same.

Materials:

- 6 brown eggs
- 6 white eggs
- 12 bowls
- MLK worksheet found here: https://www.teacherspayteachers.com/FreeDownload/M artin-Luther-King-Egg-Experiment-Response-Sheet-MLK-2298121 - (Pre-K/K students may need assistance reading/filling out their worksheet)
- Crayons: preferably skin-toned (brown, peach, etc.)
- pencils

Instructions:

- **1.** Break your students up into groups of 4-5
- 2. Make sure there are 1-2 adults per group
- **3.** Pass out two bowls, one brown egg, and one white egg to each group
- **4.** Pass out one worksheet to each member of each group
- **5.** Carefully have the students handle each color egg have them observe the similarities and differences and color on their sheet
- **6.** Have the mentor crack the brown egg into a bowl followed by the white egg into a separate bowl

- **7.** Ask the students how they look different
- **8.** Complete the worksheet

Talking Points: What did this eggs-periment show us? What does this mean when we relate it to people? **Lesson Extension**: Bring a MLK Day book to read to the students prior to beginning this lesson!
