The Cincinnati Museum Center offers a wealth of **FREE** virtual and in-person field trips and experiences available to you! The programming opportunities are available via: Field Trips, Programs-on-Wheels, or Conversations with an Expert!

The **in-person field trips** to Cincinnati Museum Center include: Cincinnati History Museum; Museum of Natural History & Science; *The Science Behind Pixar* (until April 24); Children's Museum

- Mondays, Thursdays, Fridays: no inside lunch capability; most schools AAC serves qualify for one free field trip per classroom.

Please note: no grant-eligibility for *Pixar*.

The **virtual field trips** are in-depth tours of CMC featured and permanent exhibits through video walk-throughs, expert interviews and immersive content on your schedule! Most schools AAC serves will qualify for free, unlimited virtual field trips.

Most schools AAC serves will qualify for a limited number of Programs-on-Wheels. Space is very limited.

Interact live with our team of experts! Invite a Cincinnati Museum Center science or history curator, a librarian from the Cincinnati History Library and Archives or other expert to a virtual conversation with your students. We can connect classrooms with experts in archaeology, zoology, paleontology and Cincinnati history. In **Conversations with an Expert**, you'll learn about their background, explore their research and get a detailed look at some of our fascinating collection objects. Most schools AAC serves will qualify for one free Conversation per classroom.

Virtual Field Trips Now Available! Follow our staff around the buildings and up into the domes where they show off our two gigantic and historic telescopes. You'll see how they work, how to open and spin the roof, and explore a working observatory.

In-Person Field Trips Now Available! There is nothing quite like experiencing the Observatory in person. We like nothing more than share tours of a working observatory in the heart of Cincinnati. The telescopes are just so cool! But safety is foremost on our minds. We plan to return to in-person programming and field trips to the Observatory this spring. Field trips include a brief presentation on a topic of your choice followed by a tour of the buildings. Weather permitting, you can also safely see the Sun safely through telescopes. Programs last 60-75 minutes and group sizes are limited to 14 people.

Apply NOW for a Dater Foundation Field Trip Transportation Grant!

Students gain valuable experiences by participating in educational field trips. Though, we understand every mentor company may not be able to afford this kind of experience. Thanks to the ongoing support of

the [Dater Foundation](#), Adopt A Class is pleased to provide a transportation grant program to help mentors cover a portion of their field trip costs. Transportation grants up to \$250 are available to teams on a first come/first served basis and preference will be given to non-profits and civic groups. **The transportation grant process MUST be completed by the teacher on behalf of the mentored classroom.**

For mentor companies 3 years or older, to be eligible for a field trip grant, you must complete a refresher mentor training. Safety is paramount for our adopters and students. Our training curriculum is constantly being updated and improved. Adopt A Class recognizes that a meaningful experience for both parties comes from an environment in which everyone feels safe.
